

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Potatoes New Zealand Inc. 2023 Chairman's Annual Report

The 2022/2023 year has been challenging for many of our levy payers, particularly those in the northern half and eastern coast of the North Island. The almost continuous cycle of adverse weather events has affected all farmers in both the horticultural and agriculture sectors in these regions. Those of us from outside these areas acknowledge the real cost and challenges those growers have faced and we extend our support to those affected by these difficult circumstances.



Potatoes NZ has also had a leadership transition earlier this year with the resignation of Chris Claridge who had served as Chief Executive for seven years. Of particular note under his period of leadership has been the increase in the spend on Research and Development (R&D) which is now around 50% of our budget. Chris played a lead role in developing the Sustainable Vegetable Systems project (SVS), a collaborative research program with other vegetable sector groups, which will give us a much better understanding of the way nutrients and nitrogen can be managed in potato and vegetable crops. Also under his watch has been the bringing of formally contracted services, finance, R&D management, communications and seed certification, into Potatoes NZ direct management providing greater control and significant savings in the cost of those roles.

We also bid farewell to Gemma Carroll and Nicola Loach, valued members of our team for a number of years. We wish them and Chris well in their future endeavours.

We are excited to welcome Kate Trufitt as our new CEO starting early August. Kate comes with a background in horticulture and has a very good understanding of the challenges and problems we as growers face. With her experience and proven track record, we are confident that she will successfully lead Potatoes NZ in the coming years.

I would like to note to members my thanks to Jon Davison who has admirably filled the role of acting CEO during the transition period from Chris to Kate.

Looking to the coming year, we want to flag a number of issues that should be of concern to you as levy payers. Firstly over the last several years there has been a drop off in those willing to put their names forward for election to the Potatoes NZ Board.



We received no nominations for board positions this year. This organisation is critically dependent on good representation at board level from across the country and I urge levy payers to seriously consider the role of director. While the board can appoint directors we would prefer they are elected by you as levy payers. It is not a particularly onerous role and is often very rewarding. There has been no increase in director's fees since the restructuring of Potatoes NZ 10 years ago and there is a remit to address that later in the meeting.

Secondly, next year Potatoes NZ will be running a referendum on the continuation of its levy order under the Commodities Levy Act. In the lead up to that vote we will be consulting with growers widely and looking for feedback on how we can improve the performance of Potatoes NZ.

I acknowledge that our consultation with levy payers has not been up to scratch in the last few years. Addressing this issue is paramount to getting grower support for the levy referendum, but also in the development of strategy to guide the board's decisions over the next five years. The board has already flagged this to Kate as an absolute priority as she starts her role as CEO. To be successful this organisation must reflect what growers want and providing face to face consultation is a vital part of that. I would like to thank the board and staff for their support, work and commitment over the last year. The last twelve months has at times been quite challenging. This will be my last AGM as chair and as a board member. I have enjoyed my time in this role and Potatoes NZ has in my opinion certainly come a long way since we restructured it from a HortNZ product group 10 years ago to a standalone body answering directly to its growers and levy payers.

Potatoes New Zealand Inc. 2023 CEO's Annual Report

As the new CEO, and from a background of horticulture, I am mindful of the challenges that our industry has faced over the last year but look to the future with optimism and determination to pursue our change strategy involving all stakeholders.

In 2022, our growers had to contend with climate issues, rising costs, and financial pressures with planted hectares estimated to have dropped by 20%, primarily in the North Island. However, the Farmgate value as a percentage of area planted increased by nearly 21%, reflecting both higher pricing and the inherent strength and resilience of our industry.



The higher cost structure and inflationary pressures for NZ growers have reflected through to a significant escalation in retail potato pricing as measured by the Consumer Price Index – to hopefully at least maintain the bottom line for growers. We must however remain vigilant about climate impacts on growers' production and yield across the sector.

Potato import volumes are a continuing threat to the industry. Imports dipped slightly in 2022 yet have surged again in the quarter ending June '23, potentially attracted by the higher retail prices. Despite this challenge, our export volumes grew by 2.6% in 2022, and with significantly increased export prices, the value rose by 13.8%. Notably, the greatest gains in export value per kilogram were observed for seed and fresh/chilled potatoes, while frozen product experienced a more modest 1.7% increase. Potatoes NZ collected approximately \$1.4 million in levy and, through successfully securing additional funding, spent \$1.7 million on RD&E continuing our commitment and focus on industry growth. Under our RD&E umbrella, significant progress is being made in pest and disease protection, particularly in the areas of nitrogen management and Psyllid Liberibacter research. These projects have been conducted in positive collaboration with other industry participants and, with our other projects, are regularly reported in NZ Grower, Potatoes NZ newsletters, websites, technical bulletins, R&D program events, and regional visits/meetings.

The past year has been challenging for our small team, with several changes in executive and administration staff. I would like to extend my heartfelt gratitude to our long-serving team members, Cyril Hickman, Paula Lleras, Tristan Hickman, and Iain Kirkwood, for their unwavering support. Their combined efforts have led



to the development of in-house capability for PCN and other testing, which will significantly benefit our growers. Other new faces on the Potatoes NZ team are: Bobby Hall as Finance Manager and Renu Ryder as Communications Manager. Our collective experience and enthusiasm will contribute to the continued success of Potatoes New Zealand Inc.

I am pleased to report that Potatoes NZ Inc concludes the year in a solid position. A comprehensive breakdown of our financial performance will be available mid August.




2022 Industry Overview

Potatoes are grown across Aotearoa and harvested for use in both the domestic and export market






Hectares Planted by Regional Council










